The Gift of Knowledge

In the first reading of Mass today, we hear the Lord speak to us through the prophet Isaiah: "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." What a humbling reality to grasp!

In life, each of us must grapple with the things that make no logical sense to us. We often think we know what is best for our lives, but in the final analysis, only God knows why circumstances happen the way they do. As we age and mature, both emotionally and spiritually, sometimes we are given natural

insight into why certain events are permitted in God's will for our lives, e.g., losing your job and then finding a much better one a few months later. However, there are times in which the permissive will of God remains a mystery to us.

It is in these times that we need to pray for the Holy Spirit's gift of knowledge. This does not entail academic or intellectual knowledge, but the ability to look at all things in the light of eternity. Pope Francis said this about knowledge in one of his general audiences: "Through this spiritual gift, we are enabled to see every person, and the world around us, in the light of God's loving plan." "...through the light of the Holy Spirit, we can begin to recognize how the Lord is at work in every circumstance of our lives."

As Isaiah reminds us, God's ways are above and beyond ours, but through the light of the Holy Spirit, we can begin to recognize how the Lord is at work in every circumstance of our lives. Let us pray for this great gift of the Spirit, and accept that there are certain things in life that will not make sense to us on this side of heaven!
