



Mass Intentions for 2026

Of course, our Lord always hears the prayers we offer for others, but some find special meaning in having a Mass offered for a specific intention. We have opened the 2026 Mass Book. Please be reasonable and limit the number of intentions you request at this time so that others will also be able to have their requests honored. If you are able, coming to the office is the most efficient way to reserve a Mass as it allows you to immediately see what dates are open.

Keep in mind...

- The suggested donation is \$10 per Mass, however, please understand that this is a voluntary offering and not a fee. We will be happy to offer a Mass without a gift being given.
- Some find special meaning in dedicating the sanctuary candle to a specific prayer intention. The candle that signifies Jesus' presence in the tabernacle burns for approximately 7 days and so you can have the candle burn for a deceased loved one or to honor an individual or anniversary for a chosen week. An offering of \$25 is typically given for this.

Blue Mass

On Wednesday, September 10th, Sacred Heart hosted our First Annual Blue Mass to honor the men and women that serve (or have served) our nation and communities in the military, Law Enforcement, Firefighter/EMT, or in some other way as a first responder. We had a very good turnout in the church, which included several military veterans and other current or former first responders or their loved ones. We were also blessed by the presence of local law enforcement officers from the Pinellas Park Police Department, photographed here with our pastor. This group included retired Police Chief Dorene Thomas and a friendly K-9 named Jesse!



The Blue Mass was so well received that the decision to make it an annual event was unanimous. Special thanks to all those who contributed to make this event a beautiful act of service and gratitude to pray for God's protection for those who protect us and to remember the souls of those who lost their lives in the line of duty. St. Michael the Archangel medals and prayer cards were distributed to all those who stood for the blessing and refreshments to all in attendance were offered in the cafe after Mass.

The Blue Mass, as suggested by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, will be celebrated during the week of September 11th to coincide with the 9/11 National Day of Service and Remembrance. Along with offering our prayers for the fallen heroes and all the victims of the tragic events of 9/11 and their family members, Sacred Heart partnered with the Tunnel to Towers Foundation, a wonderful charity founded in loving memory of a firefighter, Stephen Siller, that died in the line of duty on 9/11. Since then, Tunnel to Towers has been helping America's heroes by providing mortgage-free homes to Gold Star and fallen first responder families with young children. 



the Gospel is preached,


the poor are served with love,


