

Lawton Brinkman was born on September 20, 2002, in Atlanta, Georgia, to Allen and Julie Brinkman. He has three brothers: Take, his twin; Hudson; and Walker. He moved to Tampa and began school at Christ the King in 2011. He graduated from middle school in 2017 and attended Tampa Preparatory School for high school. While at the University of Tampa, he earned degrees in history, finance, and philosophy.



Following his Confirmation—a

moment he recognizes as pivotal in his spiritual life—he became more active in his parish, serving as a core team member for Christ the King's Edge program and participating in Life Teen. In college, he founded Christ the King's Exceptional Adults Ministry, dedicated to serving adults with disabilities, and taught OCIA to individuals with disabilities. He also established a Special Olympics program on campus and led a renewal of the University of Tampa's Catholic student ministry, serving as president of UT Catholic.

Although he spent six years discerning a call to the seminary, his decision was ultimately solidified during the Good Samaritan Project, in a moment of profound mercy and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

His interests include working with homeless and disability ministries, reading philosophy, conducting research in modern Church history, disability studies, and theology, as well as language learning and film.

He is entering his Propaedeutic Year at Saint Joseph's Seminary College.
