Back to the Green, Back to the Grind

Last Sunday, as we were vesting for Mass, Deacon Peter said, “next week, it’s back to the green,” referring to the green-colored vestments we will be wearing for Mass as Ordinary Time begins. My response was, “yep, and back to the grind!”

Christmas Season is over, and after time off from the routines of work or school, most of us are returning to a normal schedule. This can feel like a grind, at least it does for me. It usually takes me several days to get back in the groove of a healthy work-life-prayer rhythm. The Church calls this part of the liturgical year Ordinary Time. Though the name of this time sounds mundane, it’s not intended to be a time of boredom or stagnation. In fact, the color of this time (green) is meant to evoke spiritual growth.

I recently discovered this quote from St. Gregory of Nyssa: "sin is what happens when we refuse to keep growing." In other words, sinfulness isn’t only about doing evil things, it’s about neglecting to do good things. Complacency, laziness, and self-satisfaction are often obstacles to holiness just as much as sins of the flesh are. So, what can we do to resist this inertia? How can we continue to grow during Ordinary Time?

I am intrigued by the Japanese business philosophy of Kaizen, which means “continuous improvement.” It focuses on making incremental changes to improve performance and results. These are often mere 1% improvements, but they add up to major progress over time. I believe we can do this in our spiritual lives. What would it look like to be 1% better Catholics until Lent begins in exactly a month? A 1% tithe of time in a day is 14 minutes; could you commit this time to prayer or spiritual reading? A 1% tithe of an average monthly salary in Pinellas Park is \$41; could you donate that to a charity? What about the other gifts or talents God has given you, could you creatively give 1% of your efforts in service to others? I am a firm believer in the simple statement, “doing something is better than doing nothing.”

May the Lord grant us the inspiration and energy we need to commit ourselves to continuous spiritual growth over the next month of Ordinary Time.

De Vuelta al Verde, De Vuelta a la Rutina

El domingo pasado, mientras nos revestíamos para la Misa, el Diácono Peter dijo: “la próxima semana volvemos al verde”, refiriéndose a las vestiduras de color verde que usaremos cuando comience el Tiempo Ordinario. Mi respuesta fue: “sí, ¡y de vuelta a la rutina!” El Tiempo de Navidad ha terminado y, después de un Descanso de las rutinas del trabajo o de la escuela, la mayoría de nosotros estamos regresando a un horario normal. Esto puede sentirse como una rutina pesada; al menos así me pasa a mí. Por lo general, me toma varios días volver a encontrar el ritmo de un equilibrio saludable entre trabajo, vida y oración. La Iglesia llama a esta parte del año litúrgico Tiempo Ordinario. Aunque el nombre pueda sonar mundano, no está pensado como un tiempo de aburrimiento o estancamiento. De hecho, el color de este tiempo (verde) quiere evocar crecimiento espiritual. Recientemente descubrí esta cita de San Gregorio de Nisa: “el pecado ocurre cuando nos negamos a seguir creciendo”. En otras palabras, el pecado no se trata solo de hacer cosas malas, sino también de descuidar hacer el bien. La complacencia, la pereza y la autosatisfacción suelen ser obstáculos para la santidad tanto como lo son los pecados de la carne. Entonces, ¿qué podemos hacer para resistir esta inercia? ¿Cómo Podemos seguir creciendo durante el Tiempo Ordinario? Me llama la atención la filosofía empresarial japonesa del Kaizen, que significa “mejora continua”. Se enfoca en realizar cambios incrementales para mejorar el desempeño y los resultados. A menudo son mejoras de apenas un 1%, pero con el tiempo se suman y producen un gran progreso. Creo que podemos aplicar esto a nuestra vida espiritual. ¿Cómo se vería ser un 1% mejores católicos hasta que comience la Cuaresma dentro de exactamente un mes? Un diezmo del 1% del tiempo diario son 14 minutos; ¿podrías comprometer ese tiempo a la oración o a la lectura espiritual? Un diezmo del 1% del Salario mensual promedio en Pinellas Park es de \$41; ¿podrías donarlo a una obra de caridad? ¿Y qué hay de los otros dones o talentos que Dios te ha dado? ¿Podrías ofrecer creativamente un 1% de tus esfuerzos al servicio de los demás? Creo firmemente en la sencilla frase: “hacer algo es mejor que no hacer nada”. Que el Señor nos conceda la inspiración y la energía que necesitamos para comprometernos con un crecimiento espiritual continuo durante este mes de Tiempo Ordinario.
