So, in order to be a godparent you must be attending Mass weekly, have a regular prayer practice, in some way give of your time, talent, and treasure to help others, regularly participate in the sacrament of confession, and, if married, your marriage must be in keeping with Church Law (witnessed by a priest and celebrated in a Catholic Church) or, if not married, you cannot be in a relationship wherein you are living together without marriage.
