If you are under a canonical penalty, you'd likely be aware of it. Church penalties are invoked against those who commit heresy (c 1364), publicly "excites hatred or contempt against religion or the Church" (c 1369), teach "a doctrine condemned by the Roman Pontiff or an ecumenical council" (c 1371), misuse or desecrate the Eucharist (c 1367), and other similar, serious acts.

This is critically important. You can't guide and assist the person you're sponsoring to lead a Christian life if you are not practicing it yourself. So, in order to be a sponsor you should be attending Mass weekly, have some form of regular prayer practice, in some way give of your time, talent, and treasure to help others, participate in the sacrament of confession at least once a year, and, if married, your marriage must be in keeping with Church Law (witnessed by a priest and celebrated in a Catholic Church).
