## MINUTES

## SEPTEMBER 20, 1990

Fr. McGuire opened the meeting with a prayer. He announced that Gerry and Michelle Grasso would not be at this meeting.

#### LITURGY:

MUSIC - FRANK COSTELLO

He is new to this area. Moved from New York about a year ago. Worked for 25 years in the Archdiocese of New York.

A concert is being planned for midnight Mass at Christmas.

He is also working at the school teaching the children two days a week.

I would like to introduce new material to be sung and would also like to use the Glory and Praise book.

## USHERS - OZZIE BARBELLA

We have been working for about two to three months on getting jackets for the ushers. A sample jacket was shown to all and the price for each jacket is \$60.00 (\$54.00 for the women's jacket) This is a little more than we had hoped. We are trying to bargain with this company. At the same time we are getting quotes from different companies, one which is out of New York.

Emblems for the jackets costs between \$4.75 - \$7.50.

I would like to express a "Thank you" in the Church bulletin to all the parishioners who supported our dinners and is making it possible for us to purchase new jackets.

## EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS - LOU IZZO

We are working very well at the Masses and out on visitations to the hospitals and homebound. Sr. Carla will be taking control of this as Minister of Care.

I am preparing a class for future ministers, I have 9 candidates at this time. If anyone has a person they want to be considered, please submit their name to me. Class is being held on Tuesday evenings, October 2nd, 9th, and 16th. Installation of new ministers will be held at the end of October.

The Eucharistic Ministers will participate in First Friday Adoration from 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.

LECTORS - AIMEE SANTO

We are down to about 25 lectors, although two new members have joined us.

It has come to my attention that there has been a problem with the announcements, please be assured that this will be corrected.

I was very disappointed in my last lectors' meeting, we had only ten people show up.

I have not as yet started the childrens lector classes in the school but I hope to very soon.

COMMENTS:

Fr. McGuire added that the children in Morningstar School will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation and First Communion with our children as well as attending Mass on Thursday's at 9:00 a.m.

HOME AND SCHOOL ASSOCIATION - MARYLOU WALTER

We continued with our breakfast program through July, August and September.

Our first meeting held last night, September 19th, was very well attended with 297 parents. The fourth grade class won the trophy for the month because 81% of the parents were present.

We will continue to have breakfast served on the first Sunday of the month, bake sales and in December Santa Secret Shop. SERVICE:

LEGION OF MARY - REGINA MURPHY

We are looking for new members to join our group.

We have started services at the Friendship Inn. The first Mass will be held there next Friday celebrated by Fr. Frann. We have taken over Sun Care, and are doing services in homes. We are looking forward to the new van for our parishioners.

We will participate in the first Friday adoration from 12:00 - 2:00 p.m.

#### MINISTRY OF CARE - SR. MARY KARLA

I have been very busy meeting people from all the different ministries. We are going to put out a survey asking for more work. We are aware of about 125 homebound, however, we are sure that there more people who need our help.

I am working on a bereavement committee assisted by Gerry Dunn which is based on Hospice.

We are hoping to have a day in which all those in the different ministries can get together and share our experiences.

## ST. VINCENT DE PAUL - DAN GRUBER

Like most of the organizations, during the summer months there has been a lack of help.

We depend on donations which are down tremendously at this time of the year. However there are some people who send us checks which is greatly needed.

We like the interaction of the ministries, this is how we sometimes hear about people who are in need.

## YOUNG AT HEART - TOM MURPHY

There are now 73 paying members and I hope that before the end of the year we will have 100 members. Dues is only \$3.00 per year. We always seem to have a lot of non members join us on our trips and hopefully some of these will join our ministry.

We have several trips planned, Nashville, Atlanta, the Ice Capades in September and a trip to Palm Beach. Once again we will be going on a Christmas light tour in December.

The purpose of the group is goodwill.

WOMEN'S GUILD - JAN WALSH

We have 83 members and only 45 are active. We visit the homebound and invalid.

Our next meeting will be on October 3rd, it will have a hawaiian theme. We are asking that all of the women bring a canned fruit in support of St. Vincent DePaul.

The first Sunday in October will be dedicated to Respect Life, we ask for money and gifts in support of this.

The Women's Guild will be at adoration from 9:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

## MAINTENANCE - MICHAEL MAZZELLA

There have been many improvements around the church grounds and buildings. Everything is being maintained very well.

The work is non-stop. Most of the time when something needs to be fixed we have to stop what we are doing to take care of it if it is a emergency such as plumbing, air conditioning or lights.

During the summer a new water line was put in and the rugs in all the classrooms were cleaned. By cleaning the rugs ourselves we saved a total of \$772.00.

A lot of the work we do usually goes unnoticed so when someone stops me or the other men and thanks us for keeping everything looking so good, it really means a lot to us.

## FROM OUR PASTOR - FR. MCGUIRE

Thank you to all for coming this evening and sharing your information.

The Adoration to be held starting October is very important to the parish. It will be held once a month, however, in the future we may find the need to increase it. All the ministries including the children from the school will be participating.

We have purchased a 1991 mini bus. It is equipped with a lift for wheelchairs. It will hold about 16 or 17 people and has spaces for wheelchairs. It is maroon, is air conditioned and has an AM-FM radio.

The bus is going to cost us \$41,175.00. We have put a down payment of \$5,000.00 and have borrowed the rest from the diocese. Insurance will cost about \$3,000.00. Anyone driving the bus must have a chauffeurs license.

We are going to have a second collection once a month from November to March which will go toward paying for the bus.

Festival News - everything is going well, raffle tickets have slowed down but I am sure they will soon pick-up. The ad book has brought in about \$5200.00.

Christmas dinner party will be held on December 15th at 6:30 p.m. Spouses will be invited this year.

Next meeting will be held on November 29, 1990 at 7:00 p.m.

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL REPORT September 20, 1990

The 1990-91 School activities began on Wednesday evening, August 15th with the third annual New Parent Orientation with 95 parents in attendance. This evening gives new parents an opportunity for rules and procedures to be explained to them and for them to ask questions.

Teachers returned to school on August 16th for their week of pre-school meetings and classroom preparation. The faculty assembled for the 9:00 A.M. Mass on the first day and on Wednesday, August 22nd, the faculty of Morning Star School was invited to Sacred Heart School to share a pot luck lunch.

The first School Board meeting was held on Tuesday, August 21st. New School Board members include Alma Asuncion, Sandra Carmichael, Bill McDowell and Greg Tschiderer. They join Marie Blumetti, Mary Jo Holt and Terry Marano on the Board.

School began on Thursday, August 23rd with 234 children enrolled. The brown envelope system for weekly communication between the school and home was begun and has been working very successfully.

Programs which are in operation within the school are: Before and After School Care

> DARE program for 5th grade students - This is a seventeen week program for building self-esteem and drug resistance

Pinellas Park Police safety program

Albertson and Publix programs for computers St. Anthony's Hospital Vision/Speech screening Chapter 1 - RESS program -reading and math remediation Children attend Mass on Thursdays and will spend prayerful time on First Fridays in Adoration

before the Blessed Sacrament

All faculty members were commissioned as catechists in a special ceremony on Friday, September 14th in the Church. At the end of the ceremony, the school children presented Father McGuire with a bouquet of 37 carnations which was placed on the altar to commemorate Father's 37th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.

Faculty members have attended and will continue to attend workshops on: human sexuality, early childhood education, integrated language arts and critical thinking skills.

Response to the ad book and volunteer hours for the Fall Festival has increased greatly this year.

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Many of the recommendations from the FCC Visitation Team as well as the plans from Section K of the Self Study have already been accomplished, so the one-year follow-up report which is sent to Tallahassee before January will be a very positive one for Sacred Heart School.

At this time, an explanation of the procedures used for our weekly brown envelope system will be distributed to all ministry representatives. We are happy to distribute information or advertise your activities and we want you to understand the procedure.
