Minutes Executive Parish Council Meeting

Tim works at the school three days a week teaching music to Pre-K to 8th grade. He teaches half music and half music history. He is working on a childrens choir to begin in October at the 6:00 PM Mass. He also feels the response to the new hymnals is good.

USHERS:

Ozzie Barbella was out of town. No report was given.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS:

The EM has a meeting on September 11 and viewed the new Video. It was well received. Dn Izzo feels all the Ministers are doing a good job. The large hosts are sometimes a problem when ministering to the sick and elderly. Gerry Grasso resigned as Eucharistic Minister due to numerous duties and Anita Spruce returned to the ministry.
