Some Great News and an Opportunity!

The Catholic Ministry Appeal has replaced APA (the Annual Pastoral Appeal). This may sound like a simple change of name, but it is much more than that. The new Catholic Ministry Appeal will be a powerful way to fund the ministries of our diocese. I hope you will join me in being a part of it!

Let's start with some background. Each parish has a congregation that gives money for the running of that parish. A diocese does not have this. How then do you fund the expenses of a diocese? The most common method in the US is some form of assessment. That is, the diocese asks each parish to pay an assessment (some call it a tax!). For 2021, Sacred Heart's assessment is \$113,158 and we have paid that with a combination of APA and our Spring Festival. That money, along with what is collected from all the other parishes funds the expenses of the diocese (salaries, utility bills, and other temporal things) and its many ministries. Roughly 4 million dollars is needed for the former and 7 million for the latter.

Beginning this year, the diocese will begin a different way to fund its work. It comes in three parts.



• Part 1 is a simple assessment to each parish. This money will primarily fund the bishop's office and some support staff at the chancellery. For Sacred Heart, this assessment will be right around \$1,000 per month. It will not be a strain on our budget, and we will be happy to help the diocese in this way.

• Part 2 is a terrific act of stewardship on the part of the diocese. They are setting aside about 40 million dollars in a trust fund and the money earned from the trust will be used to fund the administrative cost of the chancellery.

• Part 3 is the Catholic Ministry Appeal (CMA) and is how the diocese will fund its many charitable ministries. We are asking our parishioners to give to the CMA in the same way that they gave to APA. All these donations will go to fund the many terrific ministries of the diocese.

Our Catholic Ministry Appeal Goal for 2022 is \$85,897.56. All this money will fund the varied and successful ministries of the diocese – everything from Catholic Charities to seminarian formation to college campus ministries. The parish has given amounts like this in the past and so we are confident that we will meet our goal. We simply need our parishioners to give to the CMA in the same way that they gave to APA. And (here's some great news), if we go over our goal (which is likely), that extra money will allow the diocese to expand their ministries!

As in the past, the diocese will ask each of us for a gift. You should expect to receive a mailing from Bishop Parkes this week. I hope you will join me in making a gift for 2022 in the same amount as this past year. And, if you are able, perhaps you will consider a small increase knowing that that extra gift will strengthen the charitable works of the diocese.

A Time of Prayer and Discernment

We want you to be a part of the world-wide Synod called by Pope Francis! In the second phase here at Sacred Heart we will be offering several opportunities for small groups to meet, reflect, and share. The session will begin with prayer and a short exercise where you will be guided to think back on your spiritual journey and how Sacred Heart has been a part of it. Next you'll have an opportunity to share your thoughts on these Synod questions:

- 1. Who is journeying with you in your spiritual life? Who doesn't have this accompaniment? Who appears to you to be alone on the journey?
- 2. Do you feel heard or listened to in the Church? What enables or hinders you in speaking up?
- 3. How is the Holy Spirit working through our parish to draw people to Christ? What opportunities have we missed?
- 4. How have your experiences with Catholics different from you in opinion, spirituality, or lifestyle aided you in your faith or challenged you in your faith?
- 5. How is the Holy Spirit drawing us all closer together in communion, participation, and mission? Where is the Holy Spirit leading the Church?

Preparing for Next Week

Next week we read about the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. It was at this wedding that Jesus performed his first miracle. The text tells us that he performed this miracle so as to reveal his glory.

The line that jumps out to me most is, "His mother said to the servers, 'Do whatever he tells you." Mary's entire life points to Jesus. It is her faith that moves her to live this way.

The reason why we admire and honor Mary is because she is a model of discipleship. From the beginning when the Angels appeared to her, she said "Yes" to God. And now at the time of Jesus' first miracle, she is directing the servers to listen to Jesus. In other words, she is encouraging others to listen, be open, and say "Yes" to God just as she did to the Angels before Jesus was conceived in her womb.

Jesus is fully human and fully God. He is the perfect "human being." I put human being in quotations because he is not like us. We can strive to be Christ like (an impossible thing to attain because we are only fully human and lacking the fully divine piece), and we can also look to Mary, the exemplar of discipleship.

We have devotion to Mary because she is the perfect example of discipleship, i.e., of what it means to be a follower of Christ. Some think that we go to Mary to get to Jesus and argue, why not just go straight to Jesus? But I argue, we do not go to Mary to get to Jesus, rather, we go to Mary to learn how to have faith like she did, how to conceive God within us, and how to be a perfect disciple of Jesus like she was.
