#### Consider...

- Some years ago, research found that new members of a church would stop attending within 6
  months if they did not make some meaningful connection with other parishioners.
- When asked for their top 3 reasons to attend Mass, "a friendly atmosphere" is consistently on the list (along with meaningful homilies and good music).

**Now consider** what happens to the average person that walks into the average parish for the first time.

- They probably get greeted by an usher. That's nice and it's important, but it isn't a meaningful interaction.
- Once they find a place to sit, no one around them speaks to them.
- At the passing of the peace a simple gesture or phrase is all that is exchanged.
- When they leave, the priest or another usher offers another simple greeting. Again this is important, but it isn't a meaningful interaction.

For the past 4 years, we have had parishioners trying to change that. We call them "In-Pew Connectors." A Connector is a parishioner who commits to knowing the dozen or so people

who sit near them at Mass. We ask the Connectors to learn names and something about each person – to get to know them in a meaningful way. Once they do that, we also encourage them to introduce people to each other and connect them.

Every week I come into church & check out who is new to me in the area I sit. It makes my heart feel so good to meet parishioners I don't know to let them know we welcome them to be part of our "family" at Sacred Heart!

This is not hard work. True, it is easier if you have an outgoing personality, but even small gestures help. A simple smile of welcome or moving into the pew so the new family can have the end may be the start of something more.

Our vision is to have enough Connectors at each Mass so that everyone, especially visitors who attend, would have a meaningful conversation with someone during their time in the church. Will you commit to getting to know the people who are sitting near you today at Mass? It may take a few months. Speed is not the issue. In time, you'll be able to spot the visitor — someone who doesn't normally sit in your area. Your conversation with them may be just the encouragement they need to make our parish their spiritual home.

## **Pope Francis**

We have heard the passage from the Gospel of Luke (6:36-38) that inspired the motto of this extraordinary Holy Year: Merciful like the Father. The complete phrase reads: "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (v. 36). It is not a catchphrase, but a life commitment. To understand this expression well, we can compare it with the parallel text from the Gospel of Matthew, where Jesus says: "You, therefore, must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (5:48).

In the well-known Sermon on the Mount, which opens with the Beatitudes, the Lord teaches that perfection lies in love, the fulfillment of all the precepts of the Law. In this same perspective, St Luke specifies that perfection is merciful love: to be perfect means to be merciful. Is a person who is not merciful perfect? No! Is a person who is not merciful good? No! Goodness and perfection are rooted in mercy. Certainly, God is perfect. However, if we consider Him in this way, it becomes impossible for men to aim towards that absolute perfection. Instead, having Him before our eyes as merciful, allows us to better understand what constitutes his perfection, and this spurs us to be, as He is, full of love, compassion, mercy.

The Church can be nothing other than a sacrament of God's mercy in the world, at every time and for all of mankind. Every Christian, therefore, is called to be a witness of mercy, and this happens along the path of holiness. Let us think of the many saints who became merciful because they allowed their hearts to be filled with divine mercy. They embodied the Lord's love, pouring it into the multiple needs of a suffering humanity.

# Have you received the sacrament of confirmation?




