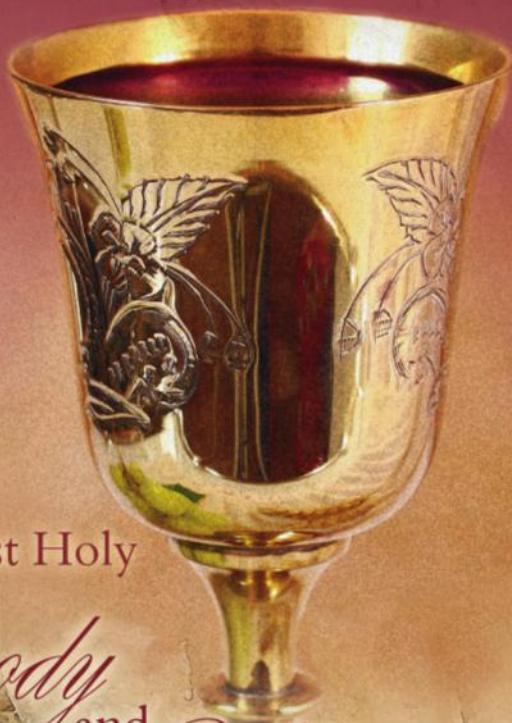


Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Over the last month or so, I have been meditating on the phrase, “take Jesus into the neighborhood.” I had been in a conversation about Eucharistic Processions and had turned to the question of why a parish should offer a procession. A few reasons were offered, but “take Jesus into the neighborhood” stayed with me.

At the end of Mass, we are not merely dismissed. Consider some of the final words that the priest is permitted to use. “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord with your lives.” “Go in peace, to love and serve the Lord.” We are not being dismissed to breakfast with friends or to a sporting event. We leave Mass to serve.

Every time we take part in the Holy Mass  
and nourish ourselves with the Body of Christ,  
*the presence of Jesus and of the Holy Spirit acts in us,*  
it molds our heart, communicates to us interior attitudes that are  
translated in behavior according to the Gospel.

Doesn't that make sense? We have just received the Eucharist. If we believe it is the body and blood of our Lord, then when we walk out of the church, we are walking out with Jesus. When we arrive in our neighborhood, we have, in a real and tangible way, taken Jesus into our neighborhood!

The challenge is to consider what happens next. Do our neighbors, especially our unbelieving neighbors, see Jesus in us? By our words and actions, do they sense that God has somehow visited them? Is Jesus really in the neighborhood, or do we think we've left him behind at the parish where he won't bother us until next Sunday?

Want to celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi? Intentionally take Jesus into your neighborhood today. Do something to serve! Pick up some litter. Help a neighbor. Spruce up a common area. Write an encouraging note, text, or email (maybe several!).

Show them Jesus! It will be the best Corpus Christi ever!

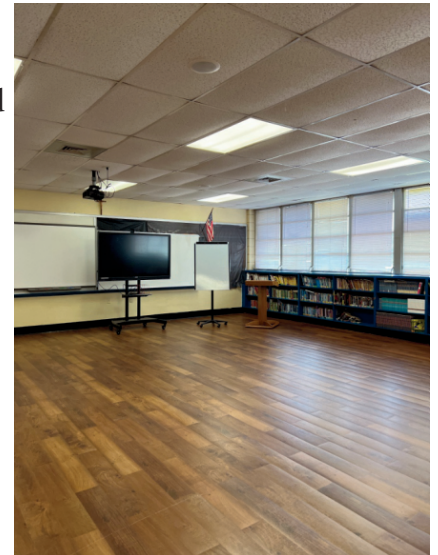

## Thanks for asking!

### *What is the priest or deacon doing after communion over by the chapel?*



They are purifying the sacred vessels. As you know, we firmly believe that during the Eucharistic Prayer the bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Christ. All of it – even the crumbs and droplets! When we finish distributing communion to the congregation the vessels typically have small pieces of host. We want to treat these with the respect that is due the sacrament and so the priest or deacon uses some water to “purify” the vessels. We pour a little water into one vessel and then pour that water into the next, continuing until all the vessels have been cleaned. Then we drink that water. You’ll notice that the priest or deacon will do the same thing with the vessels on the altar.

This takes a small bit of extra time, but it is the right thing to do. While we are purifying, perhaps you can offer a personal prayer of thanksgiving for the sacrament you’ve received.

## Pope Francis on our thirst for God and the Eucharist

Jesus sends his disciples to prepare the place where they will celebrate the Passover meal. They themselves had asked: “Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?” (Mk 14:12). As we contemplate and worship the Lord’s presence in the Eucharistic Bread, we too should ask where, in what “place”, we want to prepare the Lord’s Passover. What are the “places” in our own lives that God is asking to be our guest? I would like to answer these questions by reflecting on three images from the Gospel we just heard (Mk 14:12-16, 22-26).



The first is that of the man carrying a pitcher of water (cf. v. 13). This might seem like a superfluous detail. Yet that nameless man became the guide who would bring the disciples to the place later known as the Upper Room. The pitcher of water is the sign by which they recognize him. It is a sign that makes us think of our human family, athirst, constantly seeking a source of water to slake its thirst and to bring refreshment. All of us walk through life with pitcher in hand: all of us thirst for love, for joy, for a fulfilling life in a more humane world. To sate this thirst, the water of worldly things is of no avail. For ours is a deeper thirst, a thirst that God alone can satisfy.

Let us briefly consider this image and what it symbolizes. Jesus tells his disciples that the Passover meal can be eaten wherever a man carrying a pitcher of water leads them. To celebrate the Eucharist, we need first to recognize our thirst for God, to sense our need for him, to long for his presence and love, to realize that we cannot go it alone, but need the Food and Drink of eternal life to sustain us on our journey. The tragedy of the present time – we can say – is that this thirst is felt less and less. Questions about God are no longer asked, desire for God has faded, seekers of God have become increasingly rare. God no longer attracts us because we no longer acknowledge our deep thirst for him. Yet wherever there is a man or a woman with a pitcher for water – like the Samaritan woman (cf. Jn 4:5-30) – there the Lord can reveal himself as the One who bestows new life, nurtures our dreams and aspirations with sure hope, a loving presence to give meaning and direction to our earthly pilgrimage. The man carrying a pitcher of water led the disciples to the room where Jesus would institute the Eucharist. Our thirst for God brings us to the altar. Where that thirst is lacking, our celebrations become dry and lifeless. As Church, it is not enough that the usual little group meets to celebrate the Eucharist; we need to go out into the city, to encounter people and to learn how to recognize and revive their thirst for God and their desire for the Gospel.

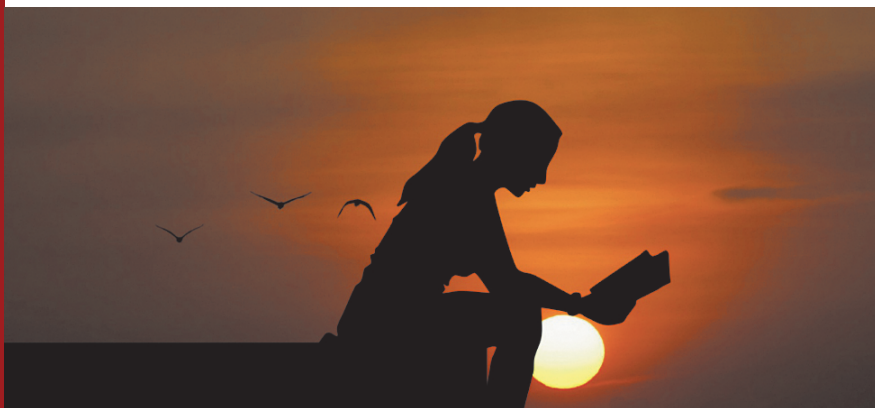
