Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time September 18, 2022 Making and Strengthening Disciples of Jesus



The parable in today's gospel is difficult to understand. That is due in large measure to the fact that all the characters in the story are rascals! The steward cheats and brings the people who owe his master money into a scheme to make them cheaters as well. To top it off, the master complements the steward for his cleverness!

Jesus concludes the parable with four distinct lessons that can be gained from the story. Let's focus on the lesson found in verse 9 (Luke 16:9).

I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings.

This lesson has to do with how we use are material possessions. We can, of course, use them only for ourselves, but Jesus teaches that we should "make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth" that is, we should use our money to benefit others; "so that when it fails" that is, when we die (a time when no amount of money can help you); "you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings" that is, you'll find entry into the Kingdom!

Putting that together you have: Use your money to benefit others, so that when you die, you will be welcomed into heaven.

William Barclay, a New Testament scholar suggests that there are, at least, two ways in which this could be done:

"It could be done as it affects eternity. 'The Rabbis had a saying, "The rich help the poor in this world, but the poor help the rich in the world to come." Ambrose, commenting on the rich fool who built bigger barns to store his goods, said, 'The bosoms of the poor, the houses of widows, the mouths of children are the barns which last forever.' It was a Jewish belief that charity given to poor people would stand to a man's credit in the world to come. A man's true wealth would consist not in what he kept, but in what he gave away.

"The rich help the poor in this world, but the poor help the rich in the world to come."

It could be done as it affects this world. A man can use his wealth selfishly or he can use it to make life easier, not only for himself, but for his friends and his fellow-men. How many a scholar is forever grateful to a rich man who gave or left money to [fund endowments] and scholarships which made a university career possible! How many a man is grateful to a better-off friend who saw him through some time of need in the most practical way! Possessions are not in themselves a sin, but they are a great responsibility, and the man who uses them to help his friends has gone far to discharge that responsibility" (Barclay, The Gospel of Luke, pg. 209).

About Our Budget



As you know (or hopefully expect!) the parish uses a budget. This is more than a financial accounting tool to see if we are overspending in some area. It is also a way for us to access how our finances line up with our mission. For example, we can ask, "How much of our parishioner's tithes and offerings go to salaries or utilities or faith formation?"

Over the next several weeks, we'll highlight some of these areas and make some comments. Remember, I'm happy to talk about the parish finances with parishioners.

This week's budget fact: 10.35% of our total income is used to help individuals and ministries outside of our parish. That means, as a parish, we are tithing! (The tithe, if you are unaware, is the standard found in the Bible for giving. An individual is called to give the first 10% of their income to God (parish, diocese, and other charities) and to live off the remaining 90%. That is exactly what our parish is doing!

At the end of our 9:30am Sunday Mass we will be blessing a class set of children's Bibles for our third and fourth grade Faith Formation class. Several parishioners helped us pay for them and we're truly grateful! You have blessed these children and many more who will use the Bibles in the years ahead.

40 Days for Life Fall Campaign September 28 to November 6.

Sacred Heart Catholic Parish, in coordination with the Diocese of St. Petersburg, is responsible to provide volunteers to pray outside of All Women's Health Center located at 4131 Central Ave, St Petersburg on Saturday October 1st and Thursday October 6th. (Hours for all 40 Days are: 8 am to 6 pm, Monday through Saturday).

40 Days for Life is a peaceful prayer vigil, not a political protest. Volunteers stand or sit outside the facility and pray individually or in small groups.

Why is it important to pray outside the facility? The no-show rate for abortion appointments goes as high as 75% when volunteers are out there praying. And 45% of abortion facilities close after 40 Days for Life even in areas where abortion remains legal.

Sign-up sheets will be in the narthex of the church this weekend and again on Sept 24/25th as well as in the Chapel after daily mass. Would you please consider signing up to pray outside the abortion clinic for one or more hours during these two days? If you are unable to volunteer outside the abortion facility stop by the sign-up table after mass for other ways you can help. Let us pray that God will provide sufficient laborers to support the pro-life mission.

The National Eucharistic Revival: For your reflection

The National Eucharistic Revival is a 3-year effort to increase understanding and devotion to our Lord's presence in the Eucharist. While the parish-level phase will begin next year, each of us can begin this journey of discernment and encounter through personal reflection. This series of articles is one way to do that.

Can I have some help, please? (Part 3)

Earlier in this series I mentioned an article by someone who summarized his struggles with the Eucharist this way: "Can we stop talking about the Eucharist as though it is simple to understand and easy to accept?"

This is, I think, a cry from the heart of someone who wants to believe and yet struggles. In other words, they are not rejecting our belief, they simply haven't yet come to a place where they can fully embrace it. Rather than criticize a person like this, we need to find ways to help them and a great way to start is with prayer.

- If possible, think of someone you know who struggles with our understanding of the Eucharist. If you can't think of a specific person, then think of a specific group or demographic young people, for example.
- Specifically, prayer for that person or group each day this week. Do more than a quick petition. You might, for example, picture the person in your mind along with the Eucharist. Then imagine the two images coming together.


